From the Producing Artistic Director Rachel Lopez

One of my favorite parts of this job is season selection. I thoroughly enjoy the process of digging through plays, reading new material, then meeting with our production delivery committee to discuss our favorites while slowly forming a vision for the season. And this year that vision was spectacular! Little did we know that a global pandemic would come along and blow up that vision, leaving us to salvage as much as possible of our JUBILEE season. I mean, seriously, you can't make this stuff up!



JUBILEE was to be a season filled with plays celebrating superlative work by underrepresented or marginalized voices. It was a nationwide movement that we were thrilled to be part of and were beyond excited to share with all of you. But now, as I write this note, I am still not sure what our 2020-2021 season will end up being. What is presented to you in this brochure is my attempt at optimism mixed with a small helping of idealism, sprinkled with layers and layers of hope. I hope we find ourselves able to safely produce all the amazing shows listed in this brochure. I hope you will once again feel safe in our theater and will rely on Civic to provide that necessary escape everyone is craving from this crazy reality. I hope our volunteers will find personal fulfillment and solace back on the stage or behind the stage or above the stage very soon. I hope we will not have to wait until 2021 to experience live theatre again. Then I'm reminded; art is the highest form of hope.

Whether we re-open this fall or this winter, be prepared for some changes. This pandemic has forced us to alter our "business as usual" practices to keep everyone safe and keep our theater operating. Our highest priority is keeping all of you, and our staff and volunteers safe and healthy while at the theater. We will do our best to make your experience at Civic as seamless as possible, but please be patient with us; this is our first pandemic, too.

Some of the major changes you will notice for this season include:

General admission seating only.

Lobby will open 30 minutes prior to curtain. House will open 20 minutes prior to curtain. First-come, first-serve seating to reduce the need for ushers and to possibly practice some social distancing between seats when/if necessary.

Programs will be online only.

Businesses who paid for program space will be in the online program and featured on the lobby monitors as Civic supporters.

No more printed tickets.

Patrons will check in at box office to be given access to the theater for seating.

Tickets for adults will be priced higher at the door.

This is to encourage pre-sale tickets so we may monitor capacity, if necessary, and to reduce the amount of in-person transactions.

Again, I ask you to please be understanding and patient with us as we attempt to exercise these changes. We are in the same boat as you, just trying to navigate our way through unchartered waters we never imagined we would have to face. We are all in this together and together we will see Civic through this; just in time to celebrate our 90th year in 2021!

One last thing I want to mention. These past couple months we have experienced a tremendous outpouring of care and support from the community and generous donors. I want to take this moment to thank all of you who gave of your money or your time towards keeping Civic going. Asking for help is never easy, nor comfortable, but in the face of a global pandemic, extremely necessary. Considering our precarious situation, we ask for your help by purchasing 2020-2021 season tickets today. If any changes happen to the season, your tickets are always exchangeable. Your purchases and/or donations made today will make a huge impact in sustaining your only local, community theatre into tomorrow.

On behalf of our Board of Directors and Civic staff, I thank you for your continued support of Civic Theatre! We appreciate you!
